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The English Indices of Deprivation 2025

Introduction

The English Indices of Deprivation (IoD) 2025 provide a set of relative measures of deprivation for small areas (Lower-layer Super Output Areas) across England, based on seven different domains of deprivation:

- Income Deprivation
- Employment Deprivation
- Education, Skills and Training Deprivation
- Health Deprivation and Disability
- Crime
- Barriers to Housing and Services
- Living Environment Deprivation

Each of these domains is based on a set of indicators. Each indicator is based on data from the most recent time point available on a consistent basis across neighbourhoods in England.

The Index of Multiple Deprivation 2025 (IMD 2025) combines information from the seven domains to produce an overall relative measure of deprivation. In addition, there are seven domain-level Indices, and two supplementary Indices; Income Deprivation Affecting Children Index and the Income Deprivation Affecting Older People Index.

The Indices of Deprivation are designed primarily to be small-area measures of relative deprivation. But the Indices are commonly used to describe relative deprivation for higher-level geographies. To facilitate this, a range of summary measures are available for higher-level geographies: Local Authority Districts and upper tier Local Authorities, Local Enterprise Partnerships and Integrated Care Boards (ICBs). These summary measures are produced for the overall Index of Multiple Deprivation, each of the seven domains and the supplementary Indices.

Guidelines for use

The Indices of Deprivation (IoD) 2025 have been produced at Lower-layer Super Output Area level, which may be thought of as a ‘neighbourhood level’, using the current (2021) version of the Lower-layer Super Output Area geography¹. Below are some key points for interpreting the neighbourhood-level data.

Ranking 	Deciles 
All 33,755 LSOAs in England are ranked by deprivation. Rank 1 = most deprived. Rank 33,755 = least deprived.	LSOAs are divided into 10 groups. Decile 1 = most deprived 10% of areas. Decile 10 = least deprived 10% of areas.
Relative, not absolute 	Comparisons Over Time 
Ranks and deciles show whether one area is more deprived than another, but not how much more. E.g. Rank 1,000 is not “twice as deprived” as Rank 500.	The Indices measure deprivation at one point in time. Comparisons between 2025 and earlier versions should focus on relative change (e.g. a shift in rank or decile), and be cautious because of changes in geography and methods.
Scores 	
For Income and Employment domains (and the supplementary Indices), scores are meaningful. They represent the proportion of the population affected, so they can be compared directly between areas. For the Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) and the other five domains, scores are not directly interpretable. Use ranks and deciles instead.	

¹ Lower-layer Super Output Areas (LSOAs) are small areas of relatively even population size, each with around 1,500 residents. The 2015 and 2019 Indices of Deprivation used the 2011 LSOA geography, while the 2025 Indices use the 2021 LSOA geography. Boundary changes between versions were minimal, with only small adjustments made in 2021.

Important Note



Throughout this report in order to maintain consistency with the LSOA level convention, for the average-LSOA rank measures rank 1 = most deprived. This differs from the published average rank figures for higher level geographies.

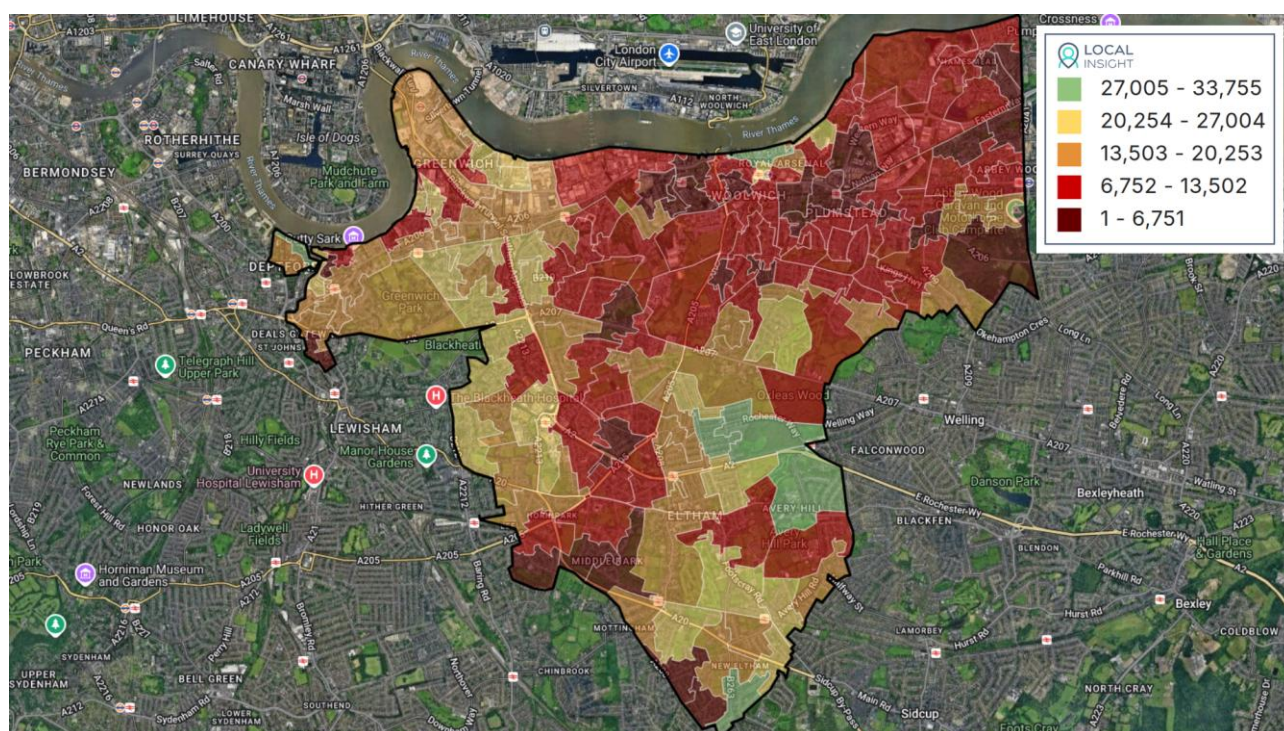
Section One: Overall deprivation

In this section, we explore Greenwich's overall deprivation followed by how the area compares with regional and national benchmarks using IMD summary measures such as; extent³, concentration⁴, average score and average rank⁵.

The Index of Multiple Deprivation 2025 mapped across Greenwich

The map below shows the Index of Multiple Deprivation 2025 at Lower-layer Super Output Area level across Greenwich. Areas on the map have been ranked and divided into 5 equal groups (quintiles)⁶.

- ⚡ In Greenwich, 17.1% of LSOAs are within the **most** deprived quintile, and 3.7% within the **least** deprived quintile.
- ⚡ The average IMD LSOA rank for Greenwich is 13,538 out of 33,755.

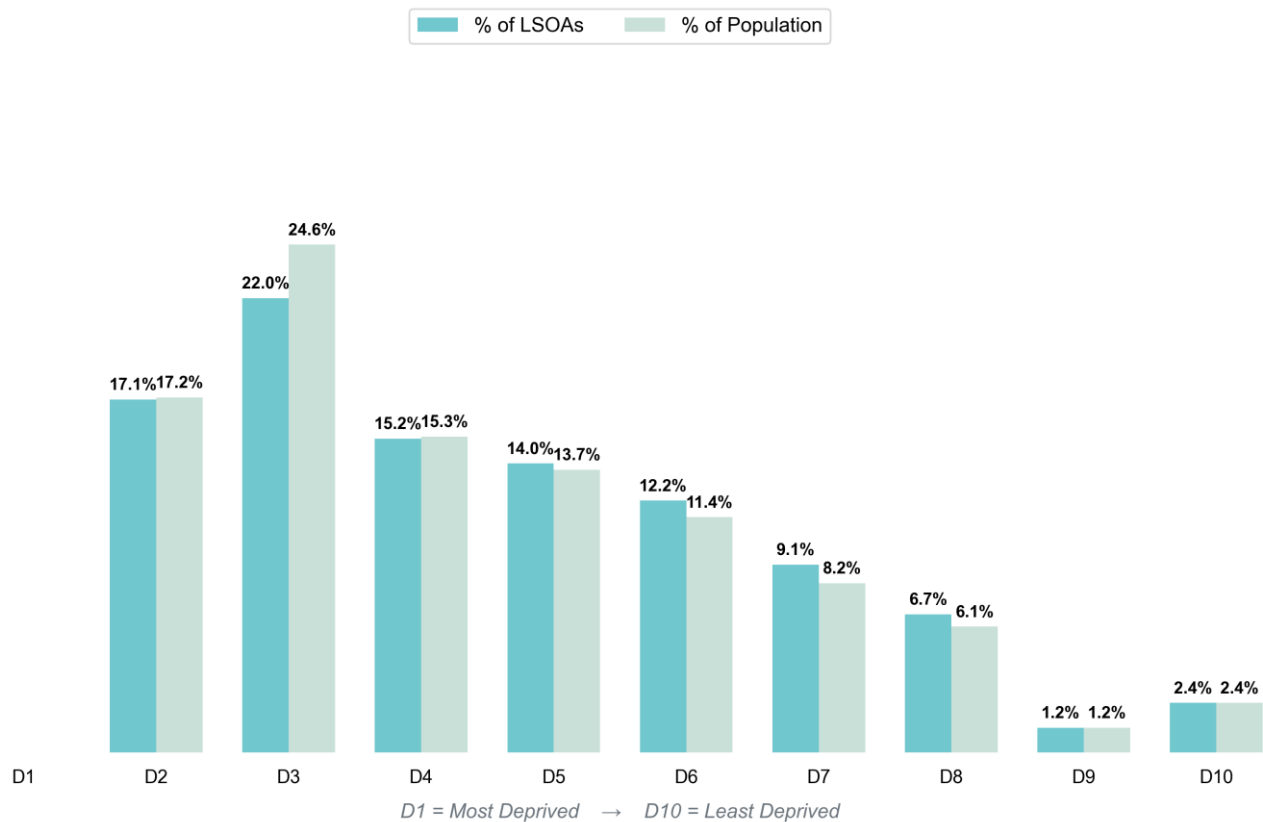

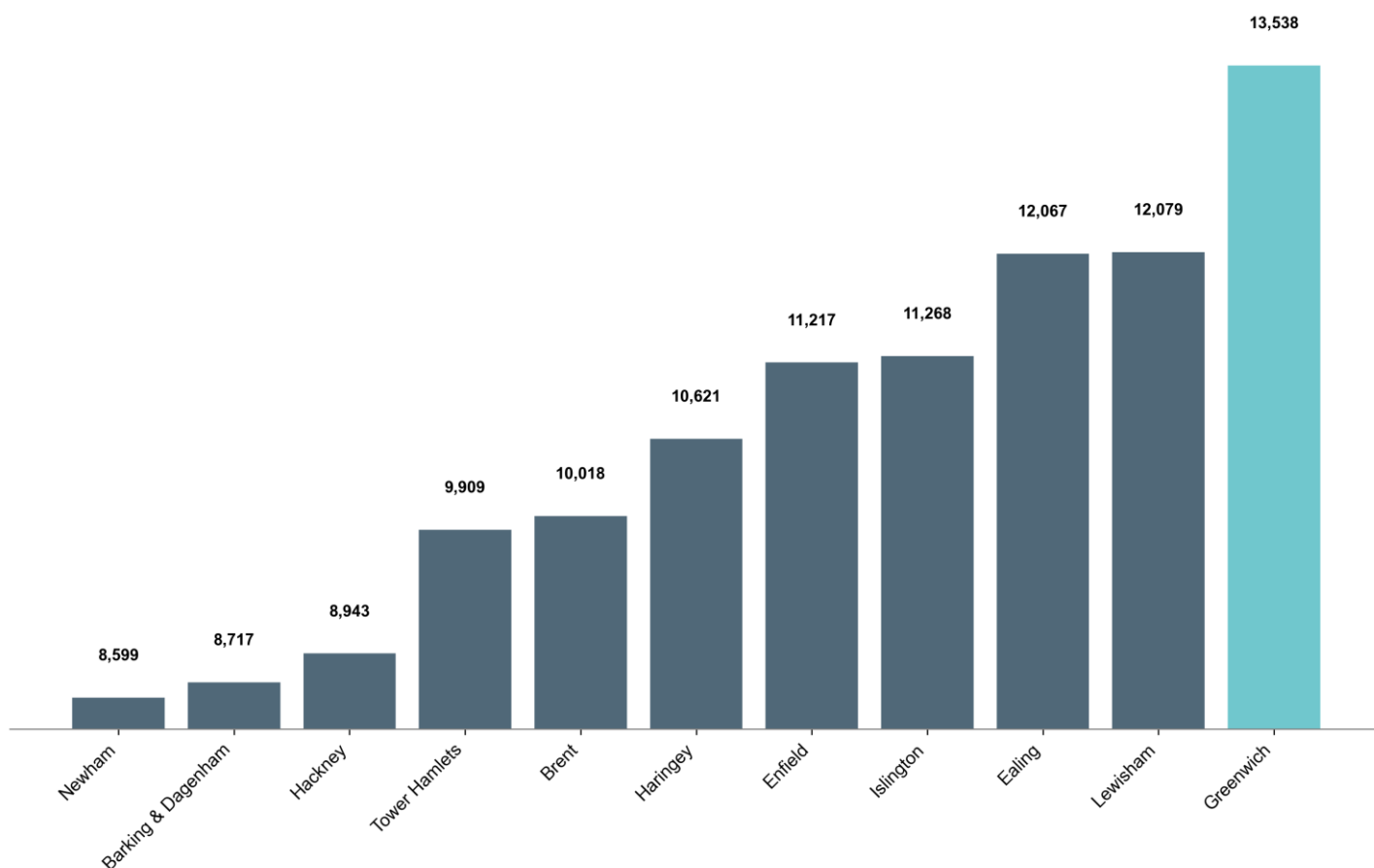

Average LSOA Ranks by Local Authority (London)



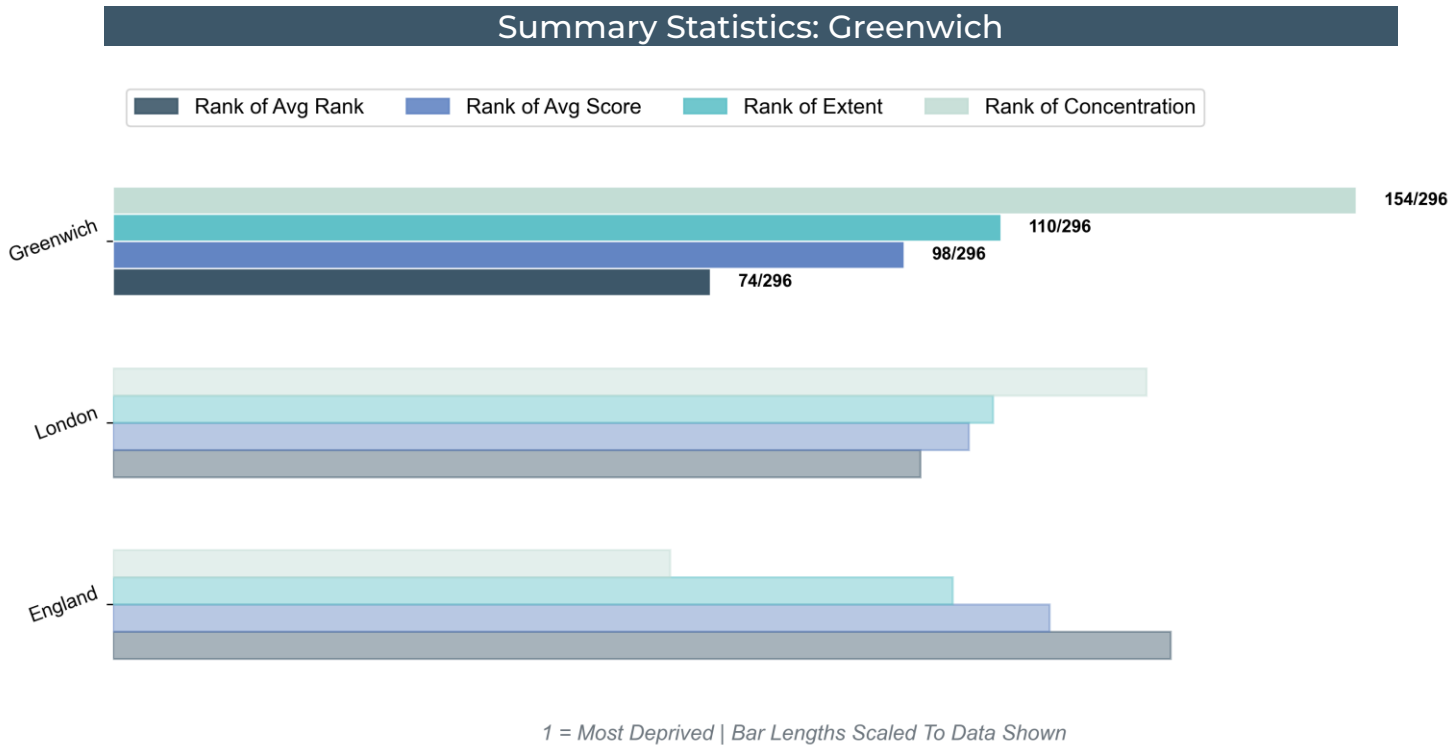

- ⚡ The average IMD 2025 LSOA rank for Greenwich is 13,538 out of 33,755.
- ⚡ Based on its average IMD 2025 LSOA rank, Greenwich is placed 15 of 33 Local Authorities in London⁸.
- ⚡ Nationally, Greenwich is placed 74 of 296 Local Authorities in England.

The chart below shows the ranks of all four summary measures⁹ for Greenwich out of 296 Local Authorities, alongside regional and England average Local Authority ranks¹⁰.



Quick Insights



- ⚡ On the IMD **average rank** measure, Greenwich ranks 74 of 296 Local Authorities in England, which is among the 30% most deprived Local Authorities.
- ⚡ On the IMD **average score** measure, Greenwich ranks 98 of 296 Local Authorities in England, which is among the median level of deprivation for Local Authorities (4th Decile).
- ⚡ On the IMD **extent** measure, Greenwich ranks 110 of 296 Local Authorities in England, which is among the median level of deprivation for Local Authorities (4th Decile).
- ⚡ On the IMD **concentration** measure, Greenwich ranks 154 of 296 Local Authorities in England, which is among the median level of deprivation for Local Authorities (5th Decile).

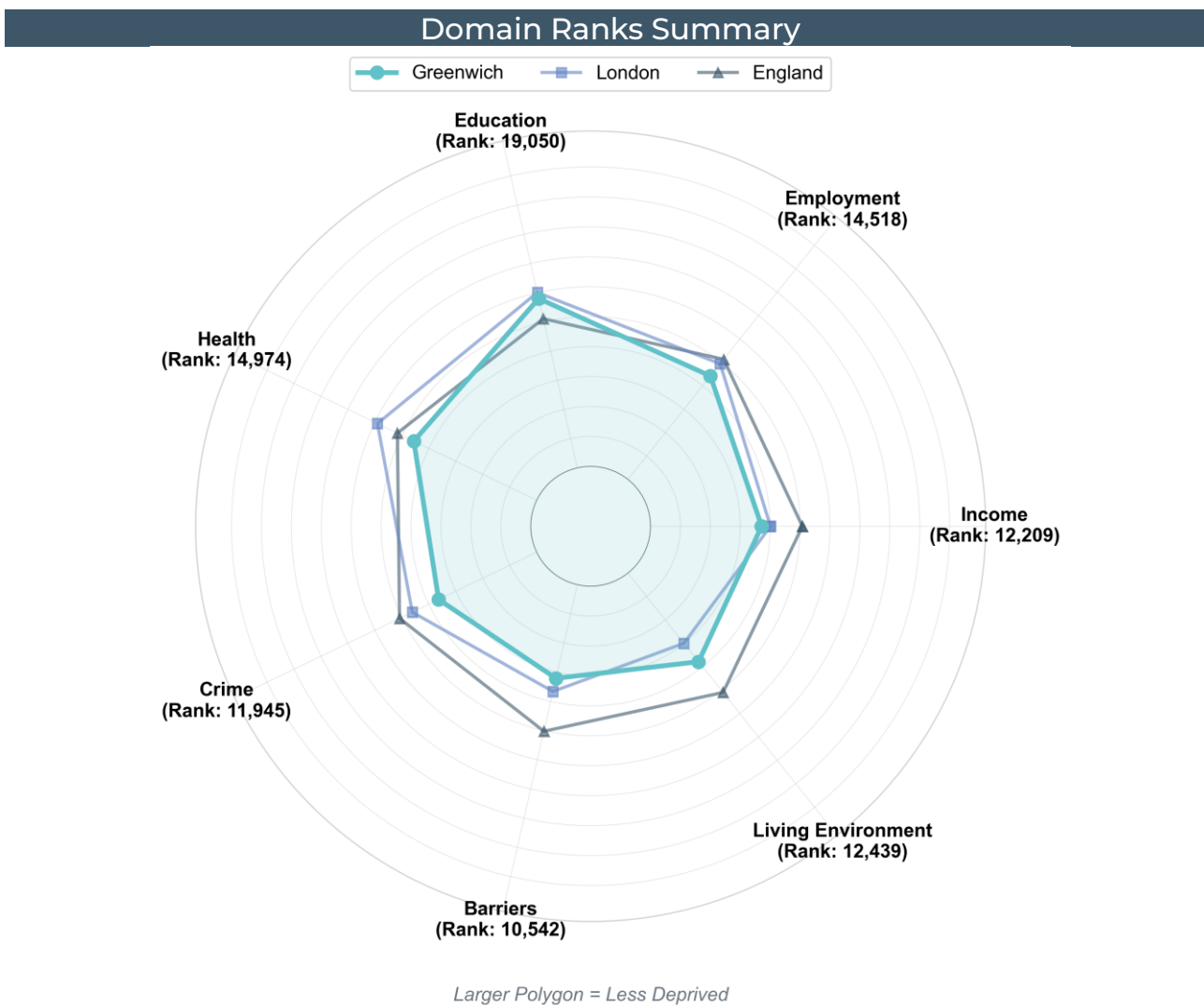

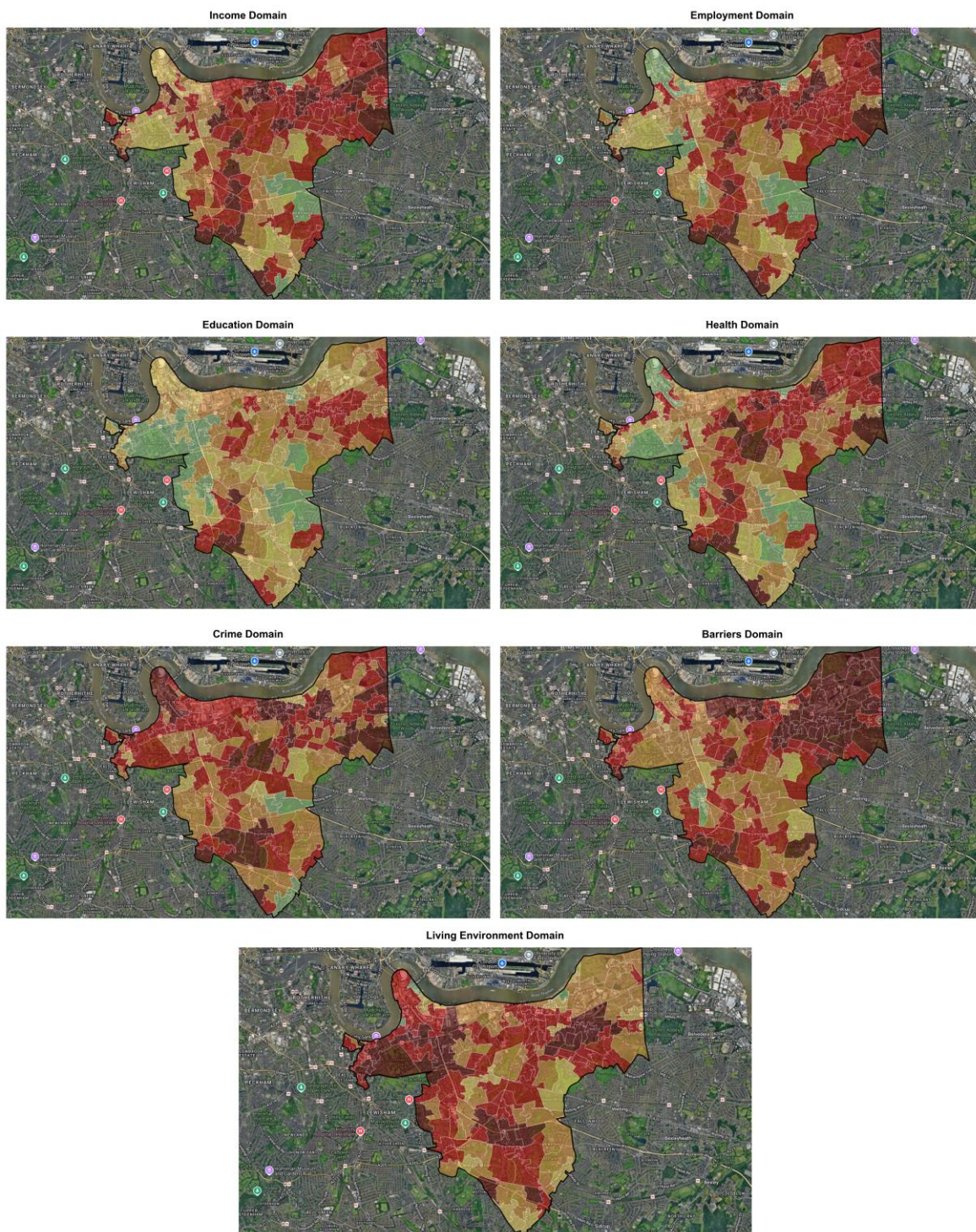

Domain Ranks at LSOA level Overview



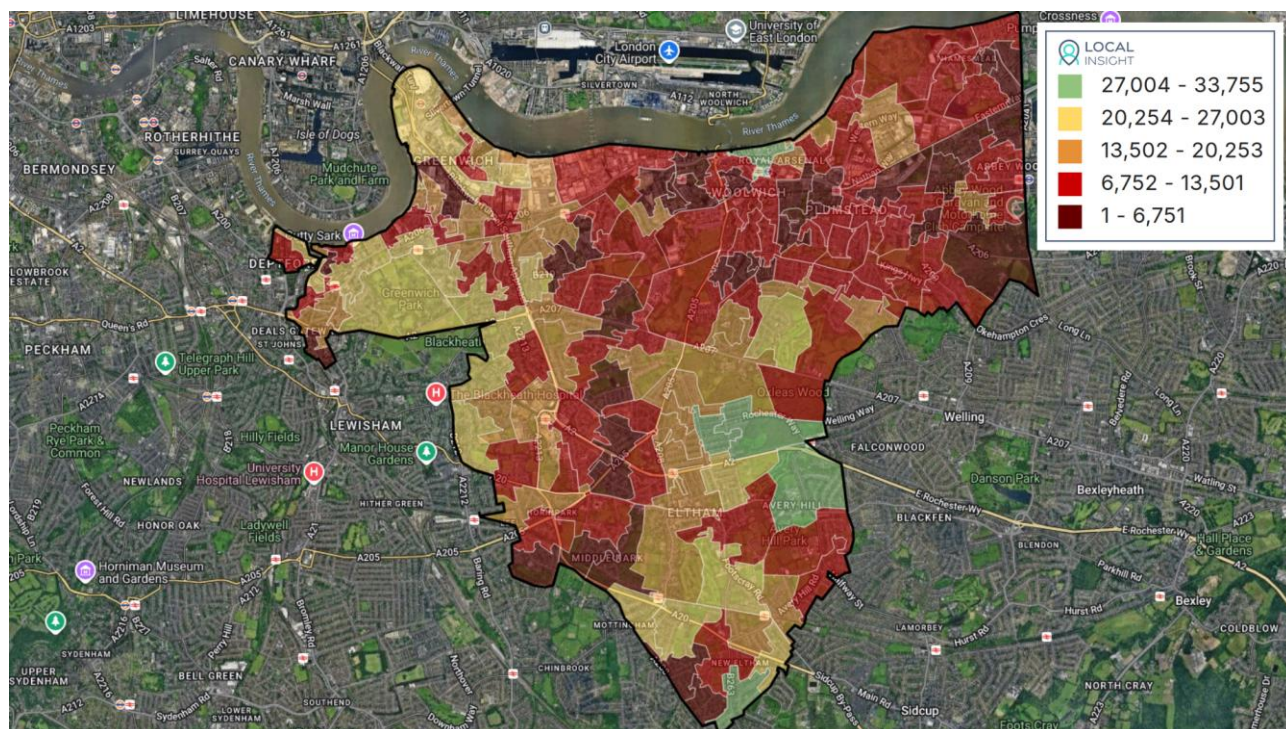

Income Deprivation

The Income Deprivation Domain measures the proportion of the population in an area experiencing deprivation relating to low income and is arguably a proxy for people's experience of material deprivation due to having low income.

The map below shows this domain at Lower-layer Super Output Area level across Greenwich¹⁴.

Quick Insights

- ⚡ In Greenwich, 21.3% of LSOAs are within the **most** deprived quintile, and 3.7% within the **least** deprived quintile.
- ⚡ The LSOA in Greenwich experiencing the highest deprivation on the Income Domain is Greenwich & Deptford Creekside - Greenwich 035G where 51.6% are experiencing deprivation related to low income.
- ⚡ Greenwich has an average LSOA rank¹⁵ of 12,209 out of 33,755 on the Income Domain.

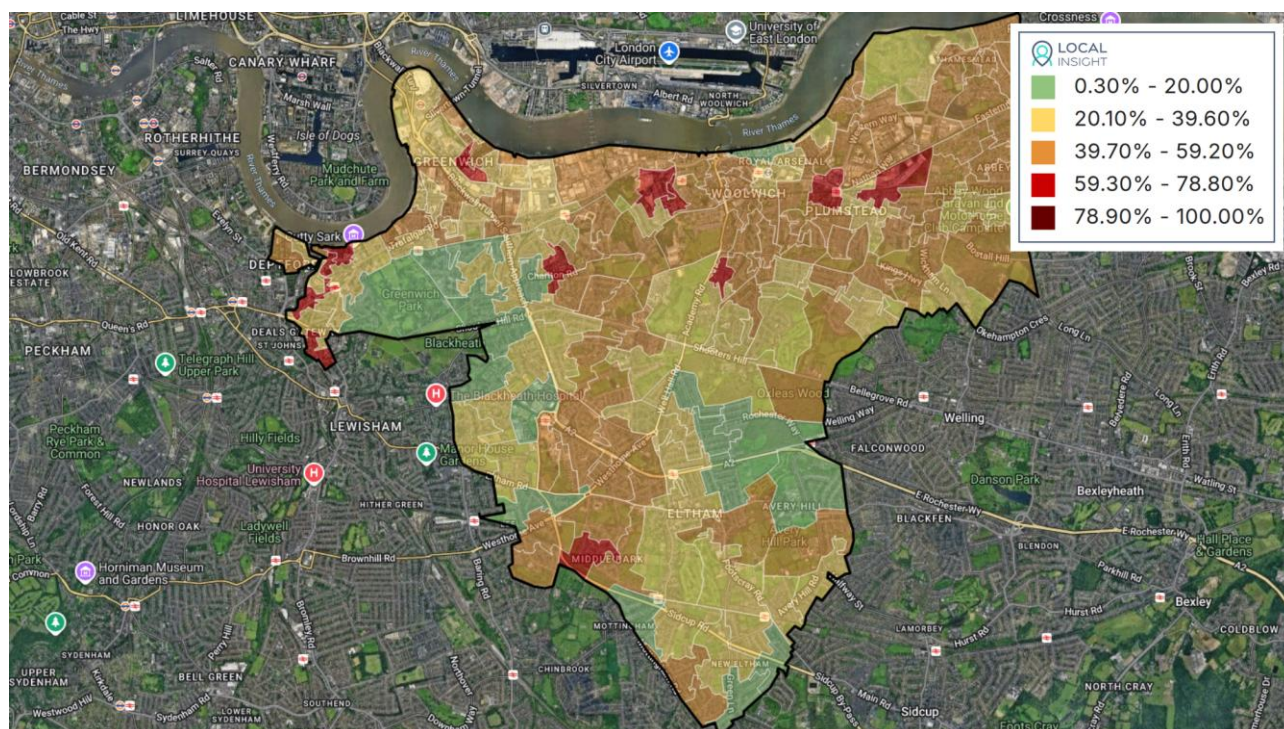

Income Deprivation Affecting Children Index (IDACI)

The Income Deprivation Affecting Children Index (IDACI) is one of two supplementary indices created as subsets of the Income Deprivation Domain. The IDACI is the proportion of all children aged 0 to 15 living in income deprived families.

The map below shows the IDACI at Lower-layer Super Output Area level across Greenwich¹⁶.

Quick Insights

- ⚡ In Greenwich, 18.3% of LSOAs are within the **most** deprived quintile, and 5.5% within the **least** deprived quintile.
- ⚡ 41.4% of all children aged 0-15 are living in income deprived families in Greenwich, this is above the national rate of 34.6%.
- ⚡ The LSOA in Greenwich experiencing the highest deprivation on the IDACI is Greenwich & Deptford Creekside - Greenwich 035G, here 76.2% of all children aged 0-15 are living in income deprived families.

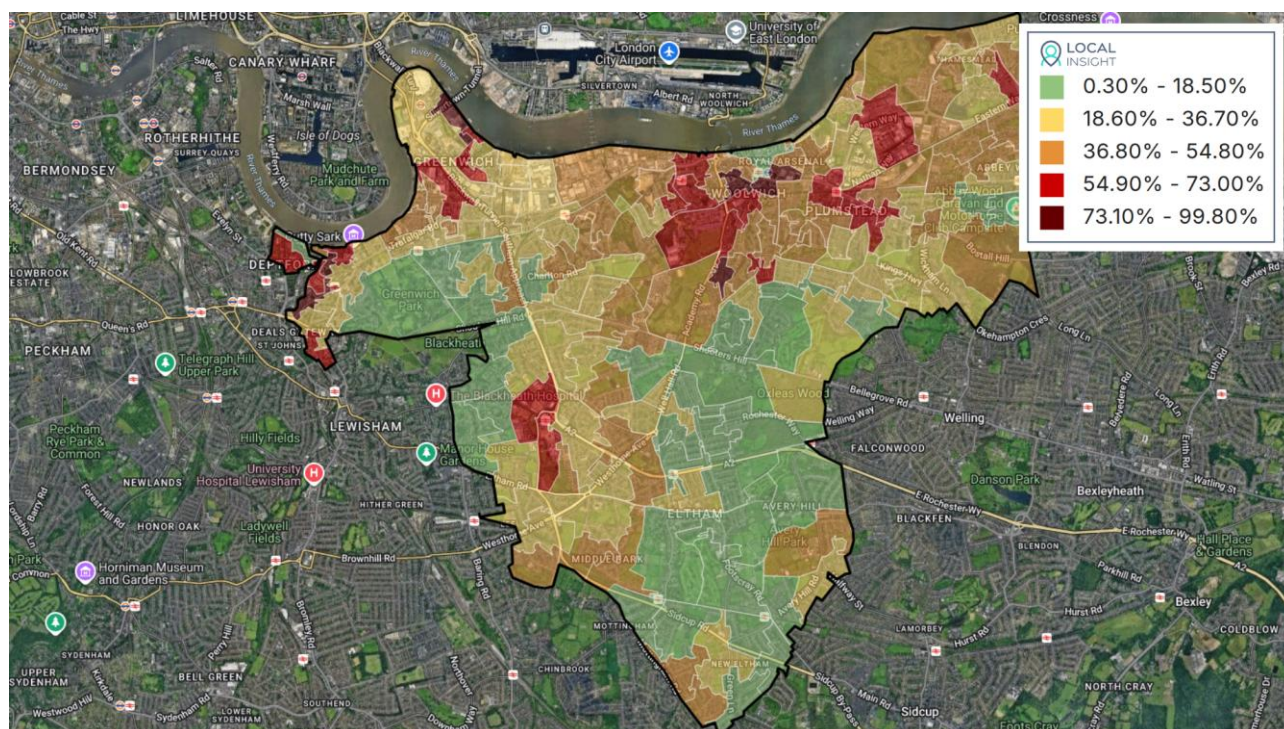

Income Deprivation Affecting Older People Index (IDAOP)

The Income Deprivation Affecting Older People Index (IDAOP) is one of two supplementary indices created as subsets of the Income Deprivation Domain. The IDAOP is the proportion of all those aged 60 or over who experience income deprivation.

The map below shows the IDAOP at Lower-layer Super Output Area level across Greenwich¹⁷.

Quick Insights

- ⚡ In Greenwich, 56.1% of LSOAs are within the **most** deprived quintile, and 2.4% within the **least** deprived quintile.
- ⚡ 31.6% of all people aged 60+ are experiencing income deprivation in Greenwich, this is above the national average of 21.1%.
- ⚡ The LSOA in Greenwich experiencing the highest deprivation on the IDAOP is Woolwich Dockyard, Arsenal & Charlton Riverside - Greenwich 042D, here 96.8% of all people aged 60 or over are experiencing income deprivation.

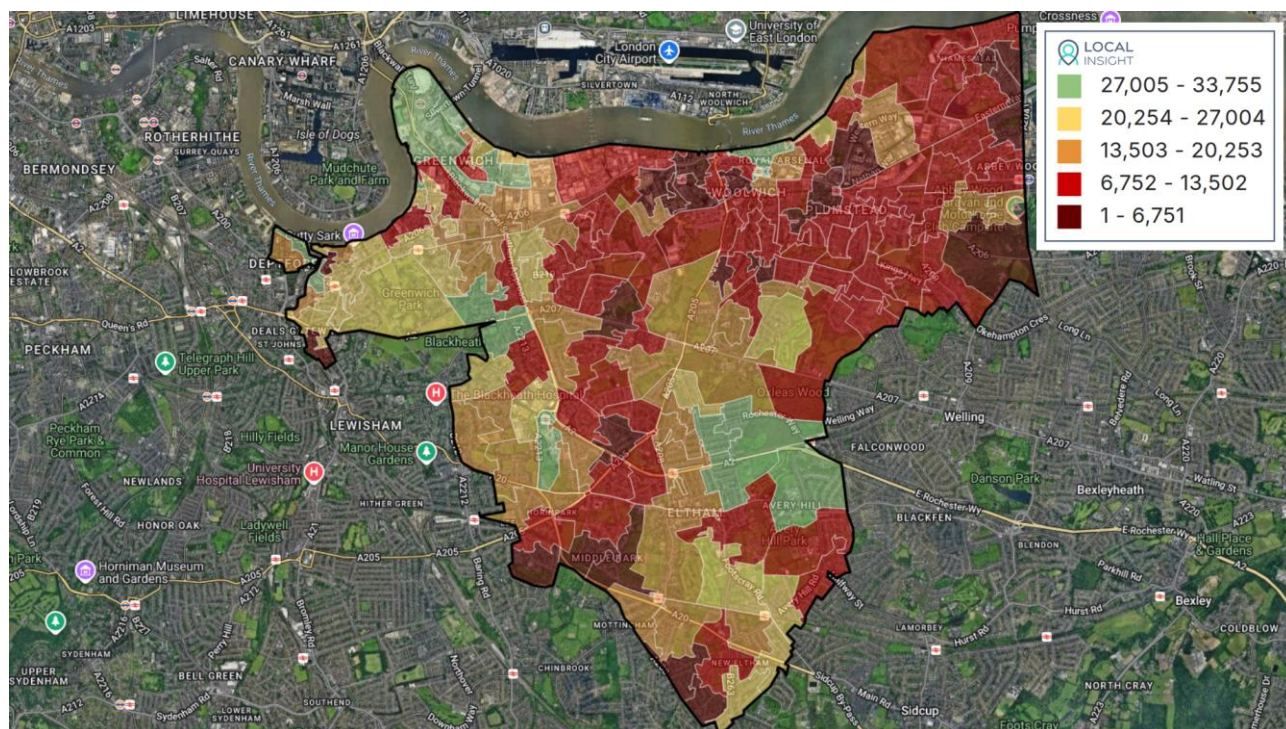

Employment Deprivation

The Employment Deprivation Domain measures the proportion of the working-age population in an area involuntarily excluded from the labour market. This includes people who would like to work but are unable to do so due to unemployment, sickness or disability, or caring responsibilities.

The map below shows this domain at Lower-layer Super Output Area level across Greenwich¹⁸.

- ⚡ In Greenwich, 14.6% of LSOAs are within the **most** deprived quintile, and 8.5% within the **least** deprived quintile.
- ⚡ The LSOA in Greenwich experiencing the highest deprivation on the Employment Domain is Middlepark & Horn Park - Greenwich 029C, here 28.4% are being involuntarily excluded from the labour market.
- ⚡ Greenwich has an average LSOA rank¹⁹ of 14,518 out of 33,755 on the Employment Domain.

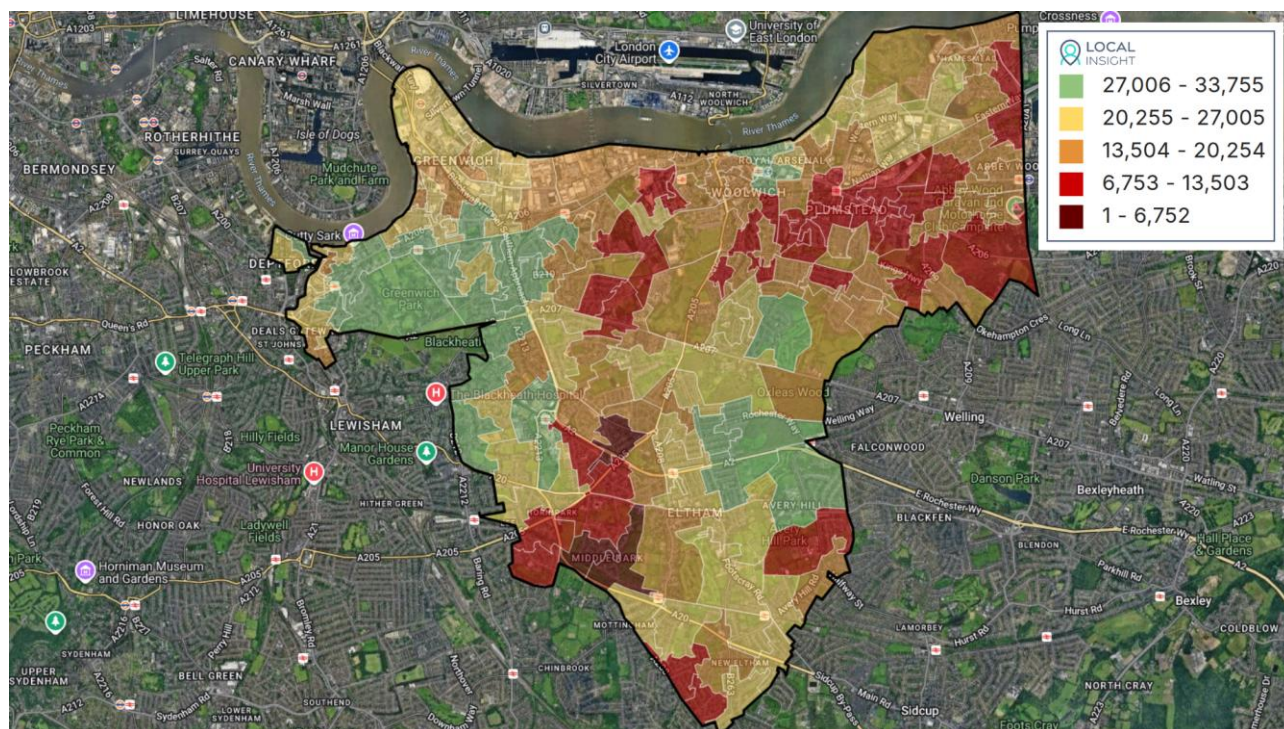

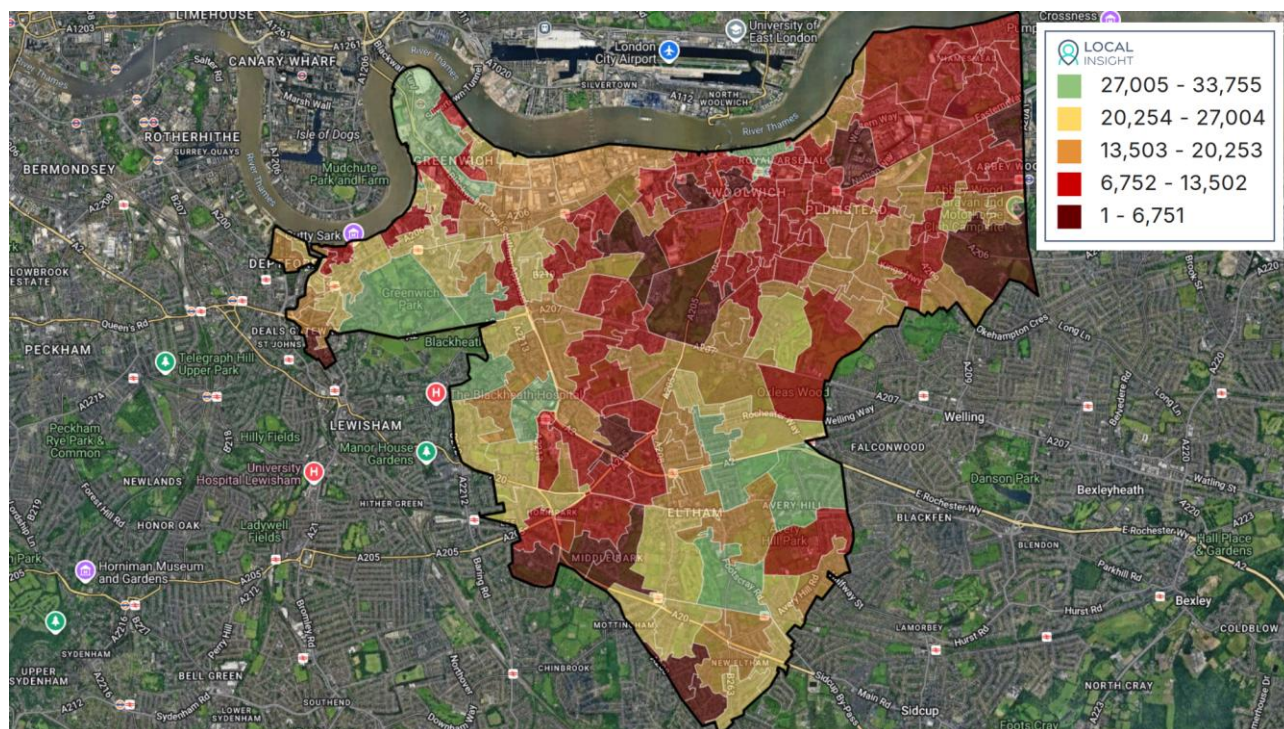

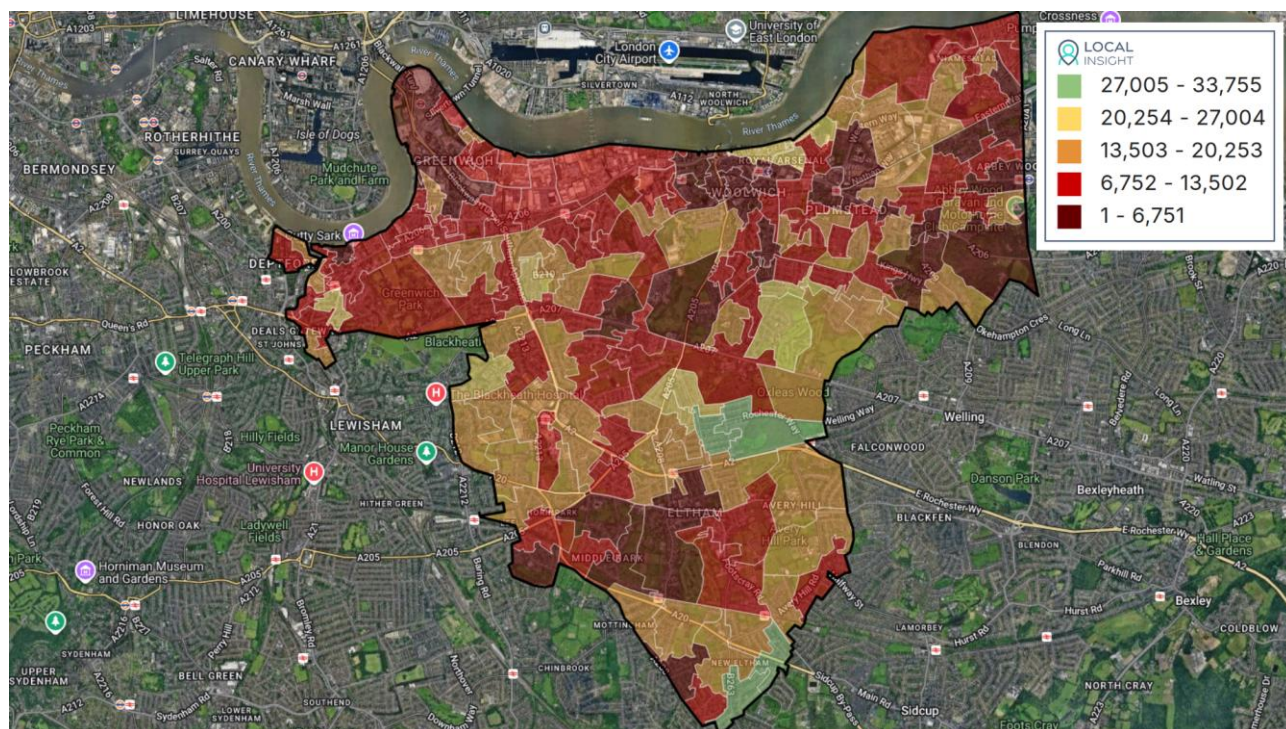

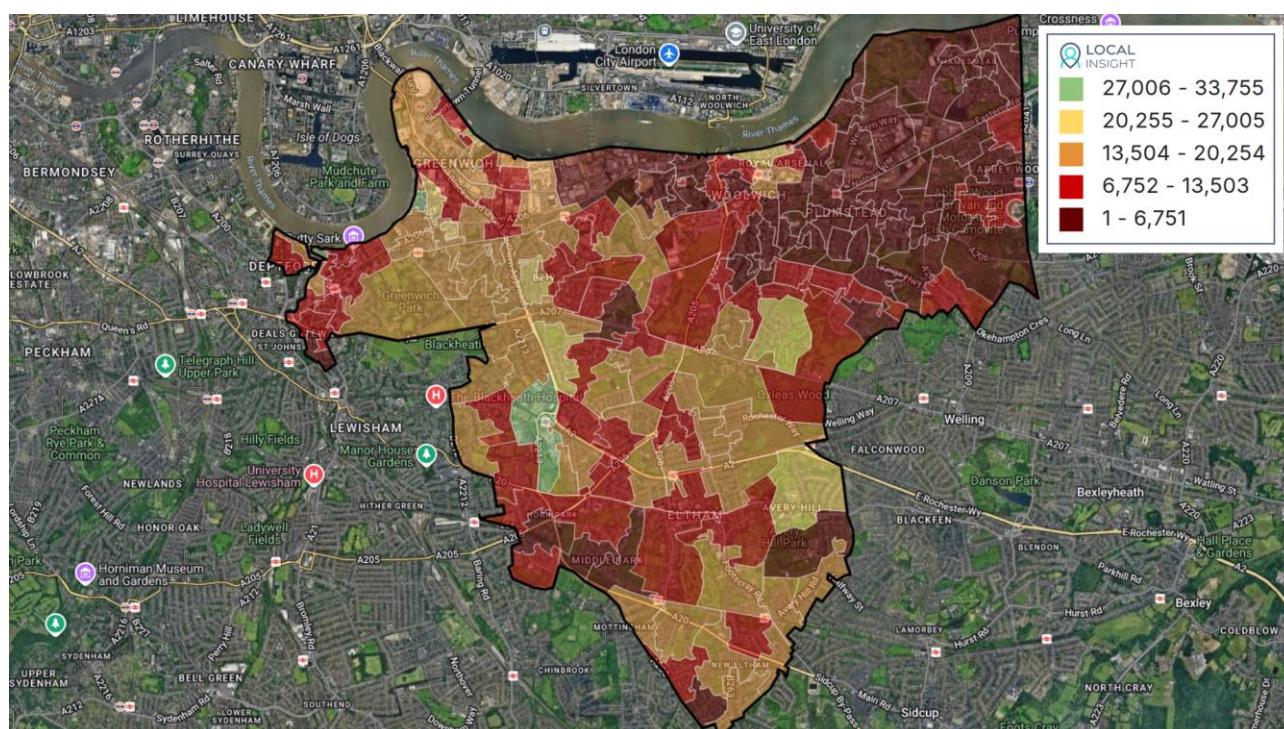

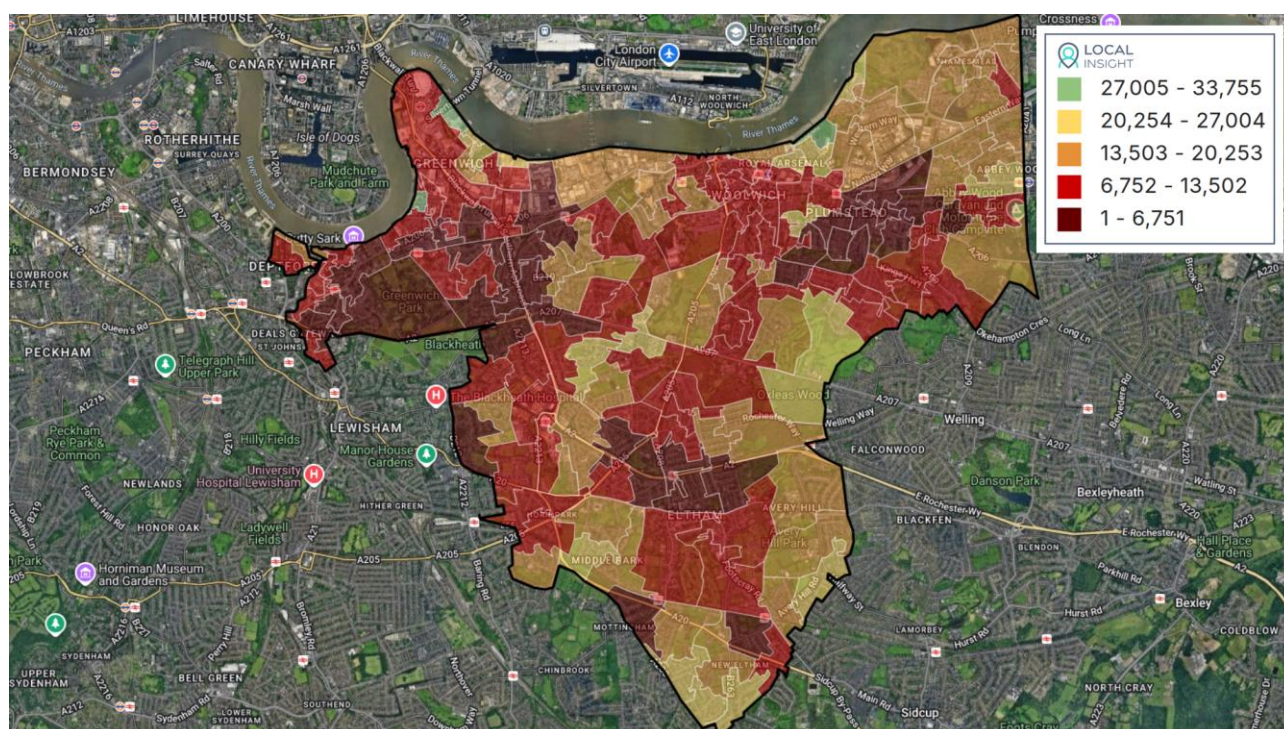
- **Housing affordability** captures the extent to which households are unable to afford entry into either owner-occupation or the private rental market, based on two underlying indicators (higher = less affordable).

Indicator Descriptions

- **Housing in poor condition** measures the proportion of social and private sector homes that fail to meet three key components of the Decent Homes Standard (higher = worse housing conditions).
- **Housing energy performance score** reflects overall housing quality (higher = worse energy performance), based on Energy Performance Certificate (EPC) data compiled by the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government (MHCLG).
- **Housing lacking private outdoor space** captures the proportion of dwellings without access to private outdoor areas (higher = less outdoor space), derived from data provided by Ordnance Survey (OS) and the Office for National Statistics (ONS).

- **Air quality** is assessed using emissions data for the four key pollutants, this provides an overall measure of environmental air quality in the area (higher = worse air quality).
- **Road traffic accidents** are represented by a severity-weighted indicator that reflects the risk of casualties resulting from incidents involving injury to pedestrians or cyclists (higher = more casualties from incidents).
- **Noise pollution** measures the proportion of the population exposed to ambient noise levels of 55 decibels (dB) or higher (higher = more residents affected by noise pollution).³⁰

³⁰ This indicator uses the Lden approach, providing a weighted average of noise exposure across day, evening, and night-time periods to reflect overall environmental noise levels.

Section Three: Changes in relative deprivation over time

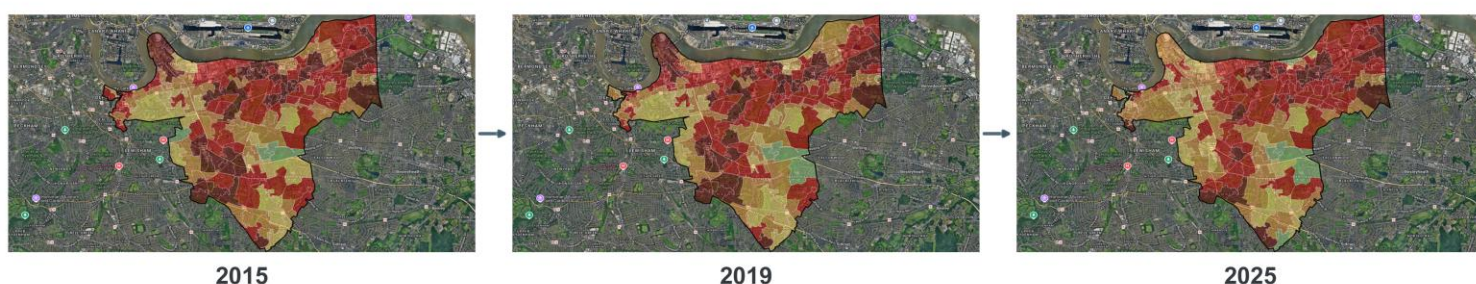
The English Indices of Deprivation (IoD) measure relative deprivation at a small-area level and are not intended for time-series comparisons.

However, the broadly consistent methodology between the 2025 and earlier versions allows some comparison of rankings at specific points in time.

Changes in IMD ranks since 2015 in Greenwich

The three maps below give an overview of how LSOAs in Greenwich have ranked on the IMD over time³¹.

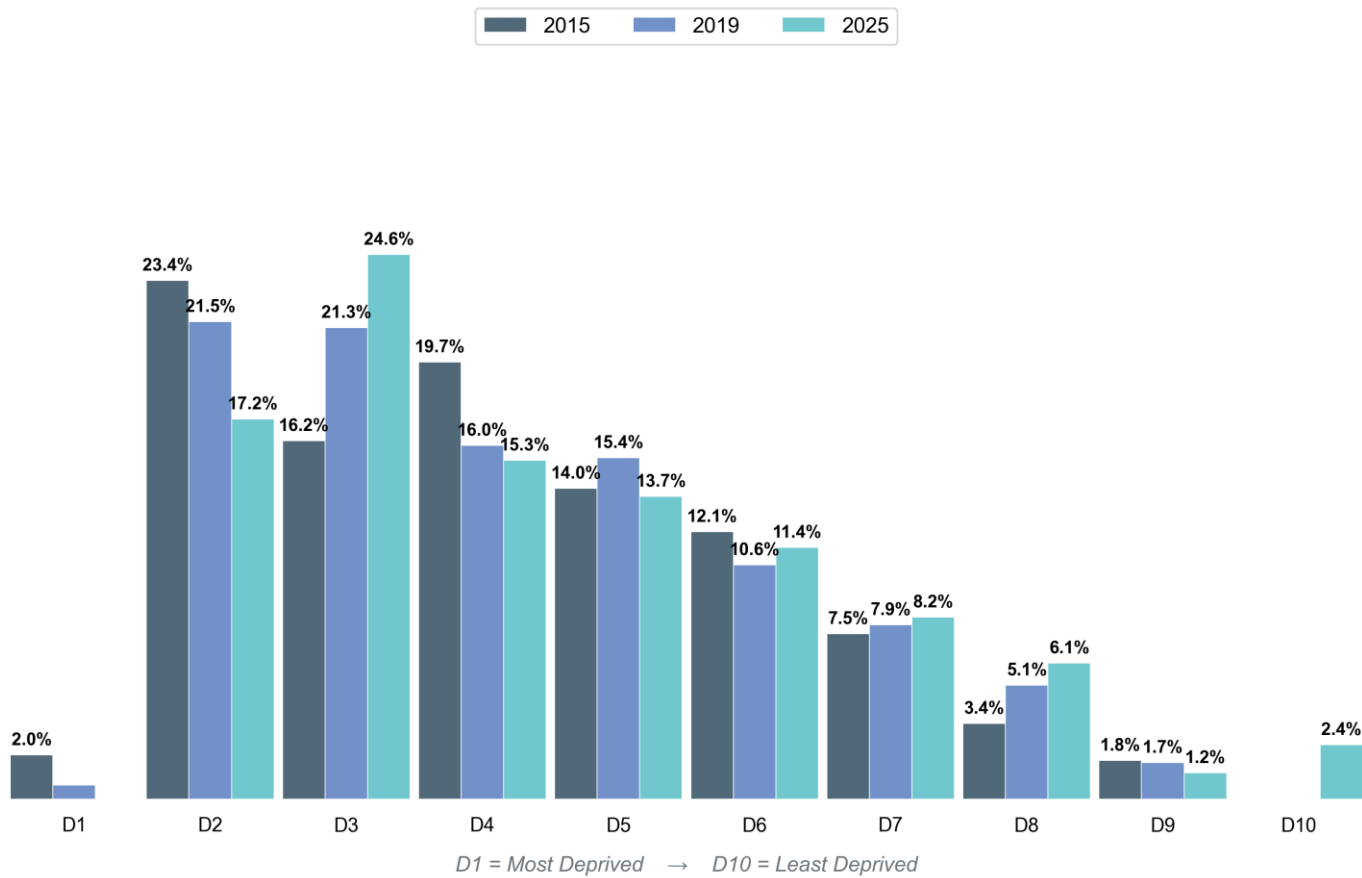


- ⚡ Since 2015, the proportion of LSOAs in Greenwich ranked among the least deprived 20% in England remained relatively stable from 2.0% to 3.7%, while the share ranked among the most deprived 20% has fallen from 25.2% to 17.1%.

³¹ While relative ranks can be compared between one iteration and another, this should be considered in the context of changes in method and geography between different versions of the Indices. ⚡ Since 2015, the proportion of Greenwich's population living in the two most deprived deciles has decreased by 8.2 percentage points

Persistent Deprivation

Across England, some areas experience persistent deprivation, consistently ranking³² among the most deprived 10% on the Index of Multiple Deprivation since 2015.

There are no LSOAs that have consistently ranked within the most deprived 10% across successive IMD releases. However, the absence of persistent deprivation does not mean there are no current support needs.

³² For the purposes of this comparison where 2021 LSOAs are either a merging or split of 2011 LSOAs it is considered persistent if any 2011 LSOA that existed within the 2021 boundary was ranking among the most deprived 10%.
